The Writing Studio is committed to helping University of Florida students and faculty meet their academic and professional goals by becoming better writers. They support independent learning and encourage scholarship by providing one-on-one consultations, workshops tailored to specific classes (graduate and undergraduate), and faculty retreats focusing on publishing original research.

One-on-one tutorials: The Writing Studio is a free service for current UF graduate and undergraduate students. Students have the opportunity to work one-on-one with a consultant, up to twice a week, on issues specific to their own particular writing development. Because their aim is to help students become more effective writers, they do not simply proofread or edit documents. They can, however, assist students to become better proofreaders and editors of their own work.
